

# HEAD KICKER THE MUSICAL

EPIC LEVELS

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
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**Overview:** You're a tourist visiting the sweet-smelling hometown of Connor Woodpond, the one-hit-wonder mega-star who wrote your favorite song, "Furry Boots and Slick Razors," but he hasn't been seen in years. There's something about this town that just makes you want to sing your feelings. After your opening number, a mysterious figure in a trenchcoat and fedora implores you to save the rec center from Head Kicker and his bitchin' Camaro gang, The Mutated Mullets.

**Dr. Professor Mr. Adult Esquire:** This mysterious figure, four kids in a trenchcoat and fedora that obscures their face, wants you to save their friends and chase the gang out of town. They're mad that their friends are being mutated and they can't use the rec center. They sing the song, "Help a Normal, Everyday Man Out," a song about how normal and adult they are.

**Trent (head)** is an earnest nerdy kid with a fake mustache and coffee grounds beard scruff. Their broken glasses fall off all the time. **Starlight (left arm)** is a mousy kid into princesses and covered in glitter. **Presley (right arm)** is a short muscular kid with a switchblade comb and is kissy with Starlight. **Reese (legs)** is a burly kleptomaniac with a candy addiction.



**Head Kicker (he/him):** This shogun of the city, kung fu dojo ruler, and slimy businessman wears a business gi and Audhelm, a bright red medieval helmet adorned with severed ears that gives the wearer super hearing and perfect pitch, but it needs to be fed fresh ears to power it. He can jump on the air by kicking it, but is notorious for sidekicking people's heads off, leaving their ears behind. His catchphrase is, "Here's your severance package!" His golden voice is high when he speaks, but deep when he sings. He's always on the roof furiously singing orders or giving commentary on the death races below.

**The Mutated Mullets:** This bitchin' Camaro loving, muscle-bound gang have been mutated by the pomade. Their uniform is furry conan boots, straight razors and a musical instrument. They play music and sing at the drop of a hat. They hang out at the rec center when they aren't escorting semi-trucks of pomade in their Camaros.

**Oil Slick Brand Mutation Pomade:** You may start as a 90-pound weakling, but when you use the pomade, you become a muscled up cretin with a passion for song, and one of these powers. This stuff can make good money on the streets.

Roll 1d4 when pomade is applied

- 1) Face melts leaving just your skull with eyeballs.
- 2) Fish head. You can only talk with bubbles unless you wear a fish tank on your head.
- 3) Hair turns into dripping lava. 50% chance you die. 50% chance you're immune to fire forever.
- 4) Wheels for feet.



**Connor Woodpond Recreational Center for Wayward Children:** Ganger's are hanging out front singing the song, "We Are the Mutated Mullets," describing how tough and into Camaros they are.

**Death Race Track:** A race track surrounds the rec center where they're doing demolition derby death races in their murder Camaros. This is how you gain a higher rank within the gang. A semi-truck filled with cans of pomade leads five Camaros who are fighting with each other to be the escort for the truck. Head Kicker gives death race commentary from the roof singing, "Kill For Me and Live Forever."

**Garage:** Mutated mullets are working on suped-up bitchin' Camaros with flamethrowers and other weaponry. They're in the middle of a rendition of "Oil Thunder" while putting the final touches on Head Kicker's war-Camaro. You can infiltrate by blending in and joining the song.

**Game Room:** The gang has rearranged the billiard and ping-pong tables to make space for Caesar Mincepie, aka the Operatic Barber. He's chopping hair with gardening shears, then pomade-mutating a line of terrified new recruits while singing songs like, "Just a Little off the Top" and "Cover Them in Cream to Make a Mutated Dream."

**Pool Room:** This swim and sauna room's main pool is filled to the brim with the mutation pomade that's smell has permeated the town in a delightful citrus-spice with a hint of vanilla. A mutated mullet ganger stands on the high dive barking orders at mutated rec-center employees using plasteel skimmer nets to stir the bubbling goo. They're shackled by the ankle and chained to a rig in the floor that forces them to keep moving in a circle around the pool. The chains dropping and slurp of the goo-stirring makes the rhythm section of their oompa-loompa working song, "Who Will Save Us?" where they lament their decisions to be fitness instructors, receptionists and camp counselors.

**Rooftop:** This is where the final showdown happens. Head Kicker climactically reveals that he's actually Connor Woodpond. A large neon sign with the rec center's name pulses red with the music. Vents and ducts from any room allow you to sneak up here. Inside a fake vent is a ledger of business associates and \$10k in paper currency. His evil plan was to get everyone singing so he can find that 2nd hit. Head Kicker sings the woe-is-me finale song, "Too Cool to Live, Too Famous to Die (In a Gi This Dope)."
